



INTERNATIONAL WIRING INSTRUCTIONS

IF A WIRE IS GOING TO COME IN FROM AN INTERNATIONAL BANK, IT WILL FIRST NEED TO BE SENT TO THE SENDING BANK'S CORRESPONDENT US (DOMESTIC) FINANCIAL INSTITUTION. For example, ABC Bank in India needs to send the funds to their US- based bank (e.g. Bank of America, Chase, Wells Fargo).

That bank, in turn, will process through our correspondent financial institution, Corporate America Credit Union. They will then send it to People's Community Federal Credit Union and we will credit your account.
